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FOREWORD

This document contains the guidelines for the awarding of full and half colours at PRG. Colours are awarded to give recognition to the learners' academic, cultural and sport achievements. The purpose of this is to encourage participation in official school activities.

These are PRG awards and the criteria are determined by the school. Awards are subject to a learner's adherence to the PRG code of conduct and may be revoked if a learner does not comply.

1. Members of the Colours Committee

The colours committee consists of:

- 1.1. a chairman(a deputy head)
- 1.2. the Head of Sport
- 1.3. the Head of Culture
- 1.4. the Head of Academics
- 1.5. an experienced PRG teacher
- 1.6. a teacher representing the learners
- 1.7. the Heads of Discipline (Junior and Senior)
- 1.8. the Head of Marketing
- 1.9. a secretary
- 1.10. all heads of activities

2. The Purpose of the Colours Committee is:

- 2.1. to award colours for sport, academic and cultural activities.
- 2.2. The following colours are awarded:
 - 2.2.1 half colours
 - 2.2.2 full colours
 - 2.2.3 honorary colours
- 2.3 to decide about the appropriate additions to the school uniform for the above-mentioned awards
- 2.4 to decide about school, sport and cultural uniforms in general
- 2.5 to decide about official lapel badges

3. Meetings of the Colours Committee

- 3.1 Meetings take place four times a year
- 3.2 Nominations for colours must be handed in to the Head of Sport/Culture/Academics on the Friday before a meeting.
- 3.3 Dates for nominations, meetings and award ceremonies are determined by the Head of Sport who submits these to the school calendar and who informs all parties involved.

5. Non-school activities

- 5.1 To be considered for a colours award in a non-school activity, a written application must be handed in to the committee. The learner has to complete [Addendum B](#) and attach the required documents.
- 5.2 Grade 8-12 learners who participate on a national level in a non-school activity may apply for half colours.
- 5.3 A Grade 12 learner who participates on a national level in the highest age category of a non-school activity, may apply for full colours.
- 5.4 **The award is subject to a learner's participation in the school's activities.**
- 5.5 Half and full colours awards in non-school activities are subject to the approval of the colours committee.
- 5.6 The name of the non-school activity that will be embroidered on the tie or the blazer is subject to the decision of the colours committee.

6. Awards

A full colours blazer may only be worn with stepouts and a blue or a matric tie.

6.4 Promerito	certificate	bronze, silver or gold lapel badge	

7. General guidelines for colours:

- 7.1 Colours are only awarded to current PRG learners.
- 7.2 Half colours may be awarded to Grade 8-12 learners.
- 7.3 Full colours may only be awarded to Grade 11-12 learners.
- 7.4 Honorary colours may only be awarded to Grade 11-12 learners.

- 7.5 Learners who wish to apply for special awards have to complete Addendum B.
The purpose of a special award is to acknowledge an exceptional achievement for which there are no existing criteria. A special award may be in the form of half, full or honorary colours as decided by the colours committee.
- 7.6 Awards are not backdated.
- 7.7 Awards will be made only if a learner represented the school in the relevant activity, except if the school does not offer the activity.
- 7.8 The majority of the committee must support an application from the head of an activity for it to be approved.
- 7.9 Should an application be unsuccessful, an appeal may be lodged with the rector.

8. Procedure for awards

- 8.1 Application for colours
- 8.1.1 the chairman of the colours committee will determine and announce the due date
- 8.1.2 the appropriate application forms must be completed:
School activities: [Addendum A: Part A](#) (the head of a code)
The head of a code is responsible for the correct spelling of a learner's name and his language of preference
Non-school activities: [Addendum B](#) (the learner)
Promerito: Addendum C (responsible teacher)
- 8.1.3 If colours are awarded to more than one learner in the same category of criteria, a list of names could be attached: [Addendum A: Part B](#)
- 8.1.4 Proof of achievement must be submitted to the committee:
Examples are:
- a) an official email from the organisation
 - b) certificates/results from the official body
 - c) a copy of an official email showing results
 - d) photos of learners at an official prize-giving
- 8.1.5 In the case of **group awards**, e.g. Drama/Orchestra/Choir, the head of the activity must sign off on both attendance and attitude of members.
- 8.1.6 The completed application forms must be submitted as follows:
- a) sport activities to the Head of Sport
 - b) cultural activities to the Head of Culture

c) academic activities to the Head of Academics

- 8.2 The respective heads of Sport, Culture and Academics compile a list of the applications which is circulated to grade heads for disciplinary approval before the committee meets.
- 8.3 The committee meets and makes a recommendation to the rector for final approval.
- 8.4 The final list of names is given to the head of the committee who gives it in to have the certificates printed.
- 8.5 The certificates are handed out at an awards ceremony – there will be four occasions for handing out the awards:
 - 8.5.1 Academic Gala Evening(only academic colours)
 - 8.5.2 Summer Awards Assembly (at the beginning of April)
 - 8.5.3 Winter Awards Assembly(end of August)
 - 8.5.4 Prizegiving (October)
 - honorary colours
 - golden Promerito
- 8.6 If the results of a particular activity are only made known after the pre-determined awards events (8.5.3), an alternative opportunity will be arranged.

9. Access to colours and criteria policy:

- 9.1 The colours policy and criteria must be available to all members of the colours committee at every meeting.
- 9.2 The colours policy and criteria will be revised once a year during the final meeting of the committee.
- 9.3 If changes are made to the policy and criteria, awards will not be given retrospectively.
- 9.4 The majority of the committee must be in agreement before changes can be made to the policy or criteria.
- 9.5 The complete policy and criteria will be available on the school website.
- 9.6 Any suggestions for changes to the policy and criteria must be circulated to all members of the committee one week prior to its meeting.

The following awards are group awards and therefore learners are expected to have attended 90% of practices and performances up until the date of the achievement. These awards must be substantiated by the manager of the choir/orchestra/singing group/drumline.

3.1 Half Colours

- 3.1.1 Top 3 of a regional competition.
A learner has to be part of the choir/orchestra/drumline for at least 2 consecutive years to be eligible (only Grade 10-12 learners)
- 3.1.2 Orchestra/Singing Group/Drumline: selected as winner of a category at the Tygerberg/ Stellenbosch/Helderberg Eisteddfod.
A learner has to be part of the orchestra/drumline/choir for at least 2 consecutive years to be eligible(only Grade 10-12 learners).
- 3.1.2 Choir: Selected as the winner of a category at the Tygerberg/Stellenbosch Eisteddfod.
A learner has to be part of the choir for at least 2 years to be eligible(only Grade 10-12 learners).

3.2 **Full Colours**

3.2.1 Top 3 positions in a regional competition.

A learner has to be part of the orchestra/drumline/choir for at least 2 consecutive years to be eligible(only Gr10-12)

3.2.2 Top 3 positions in a category of an international competition.

A learner has to be part of the orchestra/drumline/choir for at least 3 consecutive years to eligible(only Gr11-12)

3.2.3 Choir: selected as the most experienced boys choir at the national ATKV Appous Competition

A learner has to be part of the choir for at least 3 consecutive years(only Gr11-12 learners)

4 EISTEDDFOD

Accepted Eisteddfods: Helderberg, Tygerberg, Stellenbosch, Paarl Valley
Colours for eisteddfods will only be considered for learners that currently participate in relevant school activities (e.g. orchestra, choir, band, drumline, toneel, debating, debat of redenaars) unless no such activity is offered by the school.

4.1 **Half colours**

4.1.1 Winner of any category of an accepted eisteddfod.

4.2 **Full colours**

4.1.2 Winner of any two categories of different accepted eisteddfods in the same calendar year.

5 MUSIC

Accepted examination institutions: UNISA, Royal Schools, Trinity College of Music, ALMSA, London College of Music, Rockschooll

Colours will only be considered for learners who are currently part of the relevant school activity, e.g. orchestra/band/drumline/choir)

5.1 **Half Colours**

A learner is eligible if he:

5.1.1 passes Grade 7 or 8 Practical

5.1.2 passes Grade 6 Music Theory

5.1.3 passes Grade 5 or 6 Practical with distinction (+80%)

5.1.4 passes Grade 4 or 5 Music Theory with distinction(+80%)

5.1.5 is selected to take part in a national music competition, e.g. Artscape National Yourth Music Competition.

5.1.6 is selected to play in a regional orchestra, e.g. Hugo Lambrechts Symphony Orchestra, Hugo Lambrechts Brass Band, US or UK Brass Band)

5.2 **full colours**

A learner is eligible if he :

5.2.1 is the winner of a provincial competition, e.g. Johann Vos / Pieter Kooij

- 5.2.2 passes Grade 7 or 8 with distinction (+80%)
- 5.2.3 passes Grade 6 with distinction (+80%)
- 5.2.4 appears for 2 consecutive years on the UNISA roll of honour
- 5.2.5 plays in the National Youth Orchestra, US or UK Symphont Orchestra or sings in the National Youth Choir.

5.3. **honorary colours**

A learner is eligible if he:

- 5.3.1 progresses to the final round of a national music competition (Hennie Joubert/ NYMC / Atterbury / Phillip Moore / ATKV).
- 5.3.2 is the winner of the Hennie Joubert Award for gr 6 – 8 Practical. (UNISA)
- 5.3.3 is the winner of the Hennie Joubert Award for Gr 4 – 6 Theory (UNISA).
- 5.3.4 is the winner of the Hugo Lambrechts National Concerto Competition.

7.2 **Full Colours**

- 7.2.1 Participates in a production at a national competition which is placed in the top 5 (excluding technical)
- 7.2.2 Receives the highest award at a national drama competition for technical support

7.3. **HONORARY COLOURS**

- 7.3.1 Selected as the best actor or best supporting actor at a national drama competition.

8 ORATORY(ENGLISH)

6.1. **Half Colours**

- 6.1.1 Winner of an age group at the provincial Tip of the Tongue competition or receives a grading of A++.

6.2 **Full Colours**

- 6.2.1 Top 3 position in age group (Gr 10-12) at the national Tip of the Tongue competition

6.3 **Honours**

- 6.3.1 Chosen as the best speaker at a National Competition.

1. **ACADEMICS**

Absence: Should a learner be absent for subjects during an exam, the following exam will be taken into consideration.

1.1 **Half Colours**

- 1.1.1 Grade 9: Top 20 with 85% or higher for 2 Grade 8 exams
- 1.1.2 Grade 10-12: 75% or higher in four consecutive exams. Marks may only be lower than 75% once, however, still above 73%
- 1.1.3 New Grade 10 or 11 learner: Grade 9 or 10 exam s from the previous school, two Grade 10 or 11 exam results and Grade 11 or 12 June exam may be used to qualify.

1.2 **Full colours**

- 1.2.1 Grade 11-12: 80% or higher in four consecutive exams from June Grade 9. Marks may be lower than 80% once, however, still above 78%.
- 1.2.2 New Grade 11 learner: Grade 10 November exam results from the previous school, two Grade 11 exams and Grade 12 June exmas may be used to qualify.

1.3 **Honorary Colours**

- 1.3.1 Gr 11-12: 90% or higher in four consecutive exams from June Grade 9. Marks may only be lower than 90% once, however, still above 88%.

2.1 Half colours

2.1.1 Chosen to take part at the ISF (International Science Fair)

2.1.2 Awarded a gold medal at the Regional Expo.

2.2 Full colours

2.2.1 Awarded a gold medal at the ISF (International Science Fair)

3. OLYMPIADS

3.1 Halfkleure

3.1.1 Top 50 in the final round of a recognised national Olympiad competition

3.2 Full Colours

3.2.1 Top 10 in the final round of a recognised national Olympiad competition

3.3 Honorary Colours

3.3.1 Top position/winner of the final round of a recognised national Olympiad competition.

4. MATHEMATICS

4.1 Half colours

4.1.1 Represents the Boland team at the Interprovincial Olympiad

4.2 Full colours

4.2.1 Participates in the third round of the SAMF Olympiad
