



COVID REGULASIES 2022

Protokolle betreffende afsondering en noue kontak is gewysig:

Die volgende veranderinge is aan die regulasies ingevolge artikel 27(2) van die Wet op Rampbestuur, 2002 (Wet 57 van 2002) aangebring wat in Staatskoerant Nr. 45885 van 1 Februarie 2022 gepubliseer is betreffende die afsondering van mense wat met COVID-19 besmet is en dié wat in noue kontak met hulle was.

Die gewysigde regulasies lui as volg:

- Enigiemand wat laboratoriumpositief met COVID-19 toets en asimptomaties is, hoef hulle nie af te sonder nie. Indien u seun egter daarna simptome ontwikkel, moet hy dus isoleer vir 7 dae. Hy moet dus dan 'n COVID-toets doen en positiewe uitslag moet aan die graadhoof en kamer 14 gestuur word.
- Enigiemand wat laboratoriumpositief met COVID-19 toets en simptomaties is, moet hulle vir 'n tydperk van sewe dae afsonder, tensy 'n langer tydperk deur 'n mediese praktisyn aanbeveel word. Isolasietydperk begin van die positiewe toetsuitslag.
- Diegene wat in noue kontak was hoef nie af te sonder nie, tensy hulle simptome ontwikkel. As die leerder simptome toon, moet hy gaan vir 'n COVID-toets en positiewe uitslag moet aan die graadhoof en kamer 14 gestuur word.

“Screening” en sanitering

- Alle leerders moet by die hekke “screen” en saniteer vanaf 7:00-7:35.
- Leerders wat laat is, moet by Kamer 14 aanmeld waar hulle “gescreen” sal word.
- Dieselfde prosedure word by die koshuis gevolg.

Alle toetse en assesserings sal tydens die isolasietydperk aanlyn afgelê word en daarom is dit noodsaaklik dat die graadhoof voortdurend op hoogte van die isolasiereëling gehou moet word. Dit is die leerder se verantwoordelikheid om op hoogte van klaswerk te bly deur werk van 'n betroubare leerder in dieselfde klas te kry. Die graadhoof sal al die nodige reëlins met u kommunikeer.



COVID REGULATIONS 2022

Isolation and contact protocols have been amended

The following changes have been made regarding the isolation of persons infected with COVID-19 and their contacts in terms of section 27(2) of the Disaster Management Act, 2002 (Act 57 of 2002), published in Government Gazette No. 45885 of 1 February 2022.

The amended regulations state:

- Any person who is confirmed laboratory positive with COVID-19 and is asymptomatic is not required to isolate. If he should develop symptoms, then he must isolate for a period of 7 days. A COVID-test needs to be done and the positive result must be sent to the grade head and Room 14.
- Any person who is confirmed laboratory positive with COVID-19 and is symptomatic must isolate for a period of seven days from the date of the positive test result, unless a longer period is recommended by a medical practitioner.
- Close contacts therefore do not have to isolate, unless they develop symptoms. If a learner develops symptoms, then he must have a COVID-test done and the positive result must be sent to the grade head and Room 14.

Screening and sanitising

- All learners must be screened and sanitised at the entrance gates from 7:00-7:35.
- Learners who are late, must report to Room 14, where they will be screened.
- The same procedure is followed at the hostels.

All tests and assessments will be written online during the isolation period. Therefore, it is very important that you keep the grade head updated about your son's situation. It remains the learner's responsibility to keep up with work done in class and homework by contacting a reliable learner who is in his class. The grade head will communicate all the arrangements with you.
